MINUTES OF A MEETING

HELD ON JULY 25, 2019

1. CALL TO ORDER BY CHAIRMAN: The Governing Body of the City of Hays, Kansas met in regular session on Thursday, July 25, 2019 at 6:30 p.m.

Vice-Mayor Musil declared a quorum was present and called the meeting to order.

2. 2019 WATERSMART LANDSCAPE AWARDS: The City of Hays implemented a program called the WaterSmart Landscape Awards in 2016. The intent of the program is to recognize residents and business owners who have implemented water conserving turf and landscaping on their properties. The principles of the program include planning and design, soil preparation, right plants in the right places, practical turf areas, efficient irrigation, use of proper mulch and maintenance.

Holly Dickman, Water Conservation Specialist, presented the 2019 Water Smart Landscape Award to Theresa and Patrick Trapp for their residential property at 1917 Holmes Road and the Kansas Department of Children and Families, for the business property located at 2250 East 22nd Street.

3. MINUTES: There were no corrections or additions to the minutes of the regular meeting held on June 27, 2019; the minutes stand approved as presented.

4. FINANCIAL STATEMENT: Finance Director, Kim Rupp, reviewed the financial summaries of the revenue and expenditure activities of the City of Hays for the month ended June 30, 2019.

Month-to-date general fund sales tax collections were at \$602,286 which was an increase of \$172 or .03% as compared to last year. Year-to-date general fund sales tax collections are at \$3,590,996 up \$67,724 or 1.92%. The six month average is at 1.92% which is a 1.38% increase when compared to a year ago.

The report of top ten quarter-to-date sales tax collections by classification was down -\$45,121 or -2.39% when compared to the same time last year. These top ten now represent 74.3% of the total sales tax collections for June.

The portfolio of certificates of deposit on June 30, 2019 totaled \$62,500,000 with a weighted average interest rate of 2.44% up .67% from a year ago. The total balance of the Money Market account on June 30, 2019 was \$2,850,000 with a current yield of .90%. Total investments are up \$7,800,000 when compared to this time last year.

NEW BUSINESS

8. MUNICIPAL PARK TENNIS COURT RESURFACING – AWARD OF BID:

Jeff Boyle, Director of Parks, stated there are four tennis courts at Municipal Park and these courts have not been resurfaced since 2004. Staff has been contacted by numerous citizens requesting to have one of the courts resurfaced into two pickleball courts. He stated Pickleball is one of the fastest growing sports in the nation. The Hays Recreation Commission (HRC) has a pickleball league and they say it is very popular. Staff solicited proposals for the resurfacing of three tennis courts and two pickleball courts. Two proposals were received with Hellas Construction, Inc. being the low bidder at \$36,475, which is \$13,525 below the budgeted amount.

Ron Mellick moved, Sandy Jacobs seconded, to approve the proposal from Hellas Construction, Inc. for an amount of \$36,475 for the resurfacing of three tennis courts and two pickleball courts in Municipal Park with funds budgeted in the 2019 Special Park and Recreation Budget.

Vice-Mayor Musil asked if HRC would be able to host pickleball tournaments. Mr. Boyle stated HRC has pickleball leagues and he anticipates them using the pickleball courts when they are done. He added that they have recently installed a kiosk for court reservations.

Jeanie Michaelis, an avid pickleball player, said HRC held a pickleball tournament in April and hosted 19 teams. She stated another tournament will be held in September and they hope those numbers will grow.

Commissioner Mellick asked what the timeline was for this project. Mr. Boyle stated they would be able to start in mid-September and it would take seven to 10 days to complete.

9. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT EXPENDITURE: City Manager, Toby Dougherty, stated the 2019 Budget contains \$87,500 allocated for economic development activities. The City Commission has authorized \$45,000 for the payment of the year two contract with Retail Strategies. Retail Strategies was hired to provide market analysis and recruitment. At the July 18, 2019 City Commission work session it was the consensus of the Commission to not move forward with year three, the final year of the Retail Strategies Contract. The Commission asked to authorize the allocation of \$42,500 to Grow Hays representing the final disbursement of the economic development activities in the 2019 Economic Development budget.

Sandy Jacobs moved, Eber Phelps seconded, to authorize the City Manager to allocate \$42,500 to Grow Hays to be funded from the other contractual services line of the 2019 Economic Development budget.

Vice-Mayor Musil stated he supports this funding and commended Grow Hays and their Director, Doug Williams for the great job they have been doing.

Commissioner Phelps stated he feels it is imperative that we have a strong economic development effort at this time.

Commissioner Jacobs emphasized how important collaboration is. She stated Grow Hays, the City, and the County are working together on many projects and with every one working together we will succeed.

Commissioner Mellick encouraged citizens to stop by Brief Space to see what Grow Hays has to offer.

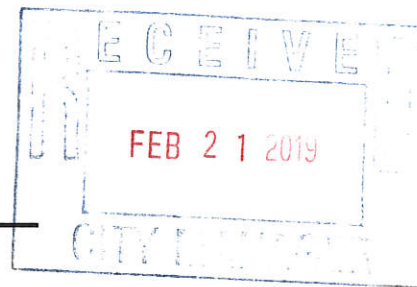
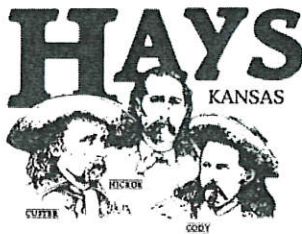

Summary

Effective July 1, 2017, the City of Hays updated electrical, building, and fire codes. Some recent concerns brought forward by contractors pertain to the 2014 National Electric Code (NEC) and 2015 International Residential Code (IRC). Staff agrees with the concerns and is suggesting changes to the codes. There are 2 main topics with changes being recommended at this time – Arc Fault Circuit Interrupter (AFCI) Circuits/Receptacles in existing dwellings, and placement of smoke and carbon monoxide alarms in remodel/addition situations. The changes being suggested remove many AFCI and smoke alarm requirements for remodel projects in existing dwellings. Staff recommends amending the 2015 International Residential Code and the 2014 National Electric Code as noted in the adopting ordinances.

Background

Effective July 1, 2017, the City of Hays updated electrical, building, and fire codes. Some recent issues brought forward by contractors pertain to the 2014 National Electric Code (NEC) and 2015 International Residential Code (IRC). A meeting was held on June 4, 2019 between electrical contractors and City Inspection staff to discuss certain sections of the adopted codes and their implications. Staff agrees with the concerns brought forth.

Discussion

Below are the two code related items discussed at the June 4 meeting. The main topics were Arc Fault Circuit Interrupter (AFCI) Circuits in existing dwellings, and placement of smoke and carbon monoxide detectors in remodel/addition situations.

Issue #1 - Arc Fault Circuit Interrupter (AFCI) Protection for Circuits

An AFCI device protects against electrical related “arcs” which commonly lead to fires. This can be an arc within the wiring system or an arc from a device, such as a lamp plugged into an electrical circuit. When an arc is detected, the AFCI trips, cutting power to the receptacle or circuit and therefore eliminates a potential fire hazard. Whereas GFCI’s protect people from shock hazards, AFCI’s protect against fire hazards that may be present in an arcing situation.

In residential remodel situations, it can often be difficult to meet the letter of the code because older circuits, electrical panels, and wiring methods are not conducive to new devices and codes. In some cases, it is nearly impossible to meet the new codes without spending hundreds or thousands of dollars above and beyond the original scope of the project. Staff feels changes to the codes are necessary to make allowances for existing dwellings when it is impractical to meet the current codes.

There are two code changes being recommended regarding AFCI codes. First, staff desires to allow modified or extended electrical circuits in existing dwellings to NOT be AFCI protected due to the high cost and impracticability of doing so. Second, replacing a receptacle should not require that receptacle to be an AFCI type receptacle. This is mainly due to the cost of the AFCI receptacle, which is nearly \$22.00 when compared to a \$1.19 standard receptacle.

Issue #2 - Interconnected Smoke Alarms installed during alterations, repairs, and additions. (Carbon Monoxide detectors also apply)

The current 2015 International Residential Code (IRC) states that where alterations, repairs, or additions requiring a permit occur, smoke alarms shall be installed as required in new construction. This means that when a permit is pulled for a remodel or addition, smoke alarms (and CO alarms) are required to be placed throughout the house (and interconnected with each other), regardless of whether or not the scope of work for the project includes work throughout the house.

In remodel situations, this code has been problematic due to access for interconnection, often requiring extensive “fishing” of wiring through attics and in walls to access hard-to-reach areas. This significantly increases the cost of a project that may have nothing to do with the majority of the dwelling. Staff desires a change to the code that would not require placement of smoke alarms (and carbon monoxide alarms) unless a sleeping room is remodeled or created, and in that case, only require smoke alarms in that bedroom and space immediately outside of the bedroom. The rest of the dwelling would remain untouched, and in theory, is still compliant to the code under which it was constructed.

Legal Consideration

There are no known legal obstacles to proceeding as recommended by City staff.

Financial Consideration

There are no known financial considerations.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 11 OF THE CITY OF HAYS, KANSAS, MUNICIPAL CODE, BY MODIFYING ARTICLE II, DIVISION 2, SECTION 11-42 REGARDING THE INTERNATIONAL RESIDENTIAL BUILDING CODE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF HAYS, KANSAS:

Section 1. Chapter 11, Article II, Division 2, Section 11-42 of the City of Hays, Kansas Municipal Code is hereby amended as follows:

CHAPTER 11

BUILDINGS AND BUILDING REGULATIONS

ARTICLE II. BUILDING REGULATIONS

DIVISION 2. CONSTRUCTION STANDARDS

Sec. 11-42. International Building Codes – Adopted by reference; amendments

Section 1. Chapter 11, Article II, Division 2, Section 11-42 of the City of Hays, Kansas Municipal Code, is hereby amended as follows:

- (b) Amendments. 2015 International Residential Code (IRC)
 - (7) Section R314.2.2 *Alterations, repairs, and additions*, to read as follows: where one or more sleeping rooms are added or created in existing dwellings, the sleeping room and the area outside each sleeping area in the immediate vicinity of the bedrooms shall be equipped with smoke alarms located as required for new dwellings.
 - (8) Section R314.4 *Interconnection. Exception*, to read as follows: Interconnection of smoke alarms in existing areas shall not be required where alterations or repairs do not result in the removal of interior wall or ceiling finishes exposing the structure.
 - (9) Section R315.2.2 *Alterations, repairs, additions*, to read as follows: where one or more sleeping rooms are added or created in existing dwellings, a carbon monoxide alarm shall be installed outside of the sleeping area in the immediate vicinity of the sleeping room.

Section 2. Chapter 11, Article II, Division 2, Section 11-42 of the City of Hays, Kansas

Municipal Code, is hereby revised.

Section 3. The ordinance shall take effect and be in force on August 9, 2019.

ORDINANCE NO. 3966

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 11 OF THE CITY OF HAYS, KANSAS, MUNICIPAL CODE, BY MODIFYING ARTICLE V, DIVISION 1, SECTION 11-310, REGARDING THE NATIONAL ELECTRICAL CODE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF HAYS, KANSAS:

Section 1. Chapter 11, Article V, Division 1, Section 11-310, of the City of Hays, Kansas Municipal Code is hereby amended as follows:

CHAPTER 11

BUILDINGS AND BUILDING REGULATIONS

ARTICLE V. NATIONAL ELECTRICAL CODE

DIVISION 1. NATIONAL ELECTRICAL CODE

Sec. 11-310. National Electrical Code adopted by reference; amendments.

- (c) Article 210, Sec. 210.12 (A) - Add the following exception:
If the existing circuit panel will not accept an AFCI circuit breaker, or if the application is otherwise found to be impractical as determined by the AHJ, AFCI protection of the circuit will not be required.
- (d) Article 210, Sec. 210.12 (B) – Strike this section in its entirety.
- (e) Article 406, Sec. 406.4(D) (4) – Strike this section in its entirety.

Section 2. Chapter 11, Article V, Division 1, Section 11-310 of the City of Hays, Kansas Municipal Code, is hereby revised.

Section 3. The ordinance shall take effect and be in force on August 9, 2019.
