- 1 Originally this site housed nearly 1,000 mules for use as draft animals; it is now home to the buffalo herd.
- 2 The original bridge connecting Hays City to Fort Hays.
- 3 Here the army harvested ice in the winter; utilizing a series of dams they had built.
- 4 Osage Orange Tree *Maclura pomifera*
- 5 Red Mulberry Tree *Morus rubra*

- 6 Catalpa Tree *Catalpa speciosa*
- 7 Boxelder Tree *Acer negundo*
- 8 Chinkapin Oak Tree *Quercus muehlenbergii*
- 9 Burr Oak Tree *Quercus macrocarpa*
- 10 Sycamore Tree *Platanus occidentalis*

- 11 Eastern Redbud Tree *Cercis canadensis*
- 12 Kentucky Coffee Tree *Gymnocladus dioicus*
- 13 Northern Hackberry Tree *Celtis occidentalis*
- 14 The location of the first Hays county fair held on September 26th - 28th, 1883. Now the site of Dusty Glassman Ballfields.

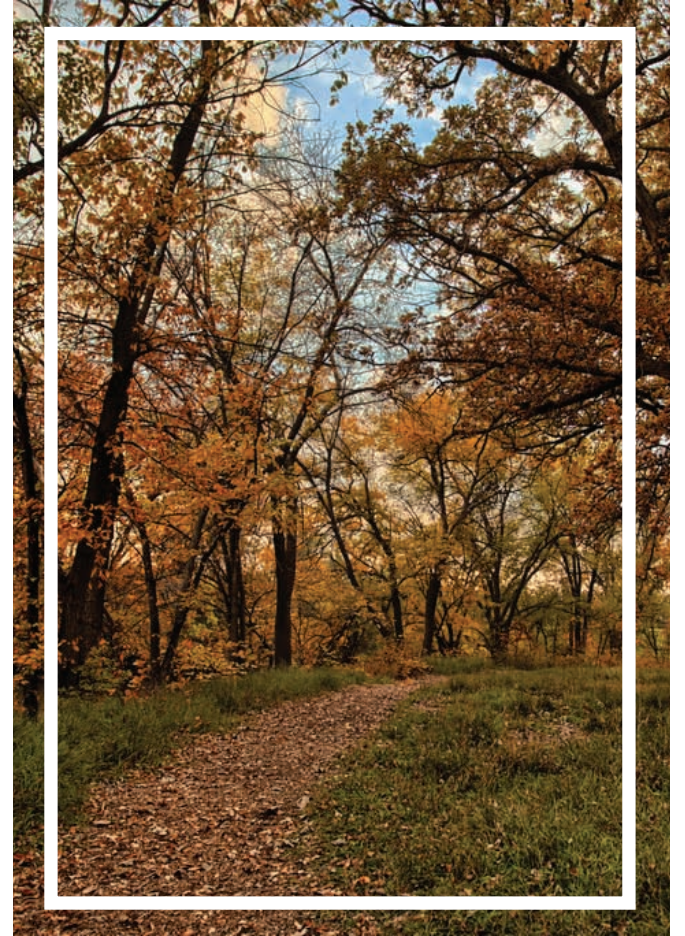
